▪ **Clothing & ID - Mandatory**

Wear **comfortable closed-toed shoes and yellow Magnet T-shirt**. You will be walking part of the time and walking about one-half mile to and from Heritage Park. Appropriate dress is essential for your safety. **You must bring and wear your ID. A hat, sunglasses, sunscreen, and insect repellent are highly recommended.**

▪ **Fishing Pole and Tackle**

YEA! Will provide both a pole to use and bait/lures at the park. However, you may also bring your own fishing pole and tackle.

▪ **Food & Drink**

Bring a water bottle and snacks. Lunch will be on campus on your own (**LUNCH A for Trip 2 and 4**)

▪ **Don't Forget**

Morning Trips AM - Go directly to the Magnet Amphitheater at the start of school; do not go to class!

Afternoon Trips PM - After Period 6 ends, go to **LUNCH A**; after lunch go directly to the amphitheater - do not go to class!

“Responsible Angling Program and Trip”

Site Visits are NOT Optional; Planned Part of Magnet Curriculum

Each year, South Plantation's 9th grade Magnet students take part in a unique in-school program and field trip. The program takes place in the classroom, on school campus, and at Plantation Heritage Park.

The Responsible Angling Program is facilitated and created by the Youth Environmental Alliance, aka: YEA! The program is a three-day experience in the classroom and outside. Be prepared for each day!

1. Ethical Angling – 1st session

February 6th (gold day) or
February 7th, 2022 (purple day)

2. Rigging and Reels – 2nd session

February 8th (gold day) or
February 9th (purple day)

3. Fishing Trip – 3rd session

February 10th (gold day) or February 13th (purple day) half-day field trip. Students walk to Heritage Park and use their skills to try and catch a fish.

SBBC code of conduct rules and consequences are enforced during these programs – on and off campus. Safety is our top priority! Students who violate the rules may have their field trip privileges revoked, removed from current and upcoming field trips, and any special programs within the Magnet program.

Field trips and programs are an integral part of the curriculum and students will apply and use field investigation skills throughout the year.

Any student who does not attend the trip will be required to complete the alternative assignment to receive academic credit.

If any of the programs are cancelled, students will resume their regular in-class curriculum – school-wide refund policy will be enforced, if applicable.

Responsible Angling

Session 1: Students learn about fisheries, aquatic environments, and economics associated with fishing. Responsible angling and regulations are taught, as well as history in the first session.

Fishing Skills

Session 2: Students will get hands-on training using various types of rigging for freshwater fishing. Students will practice tying knots, using and baiting hooks, and learning about types of bait. Additionally, students will learn to use a rod and reel by practicing on campus before the trip.

Fishing Trip

Session 3: Time to celebrate and go fishing! The final session of the program is a half-school day trip to Plantation Heritage Park... poles and tackle included! Students will get a chance to use their skills and fish at the lake in the park.
